Sept. 19, Walk 1 - Street foods (Home tour)

Relish Delhi's street foods, not in a crowded area but as a home tour or in a well reputed café known for street foods. In clean, hygienic surroundings, learn the do's and don'ts of street foods, sample the tempting vegetarian snacks you see on the streets but don't dare try.

Sept. 26, Walk 2 - Siri, 2nd city of Delhi

In this walk we find the fascinating city of Siri. Believe it or not it exists in the colonies we know – HausKhas enclave, Shahpurjat, Sirifort etc.

Oct 2 (Wed.), Walk 3 – Finding Bapu (Gandhi ji) on his birthday

We meet the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi in Delhi were his soul resides – not in museums. Bapu's Delhi address is where he lived in the *Harijanbasti*.

Oct. 9 (Wed.), Walk 4 - Durga Puja Pandal hoping

Here we meet Goddess Durga during the festival where she is revered by the Bengali community in Delhi. We hop pandals that are temporary erected to house the deity.

Nov. 7, Walk 5 - Haus Khas village

The area in and around the HausKhas village is fascinating – temples, forests, markets, monuments gives this space a vibrant character. Surely you have been- walk with me to know the area better.

Nov. 14, Walk 6 - Spiritual Delhi in ChandiniChowk

No tour of Delhi is complete without an understanding of our religious culture. In this spiritual tour we 'visit' 3 temples: Hindu, Jain and Sikh (all situated in ChandniChowk) to witness and discuss the various forms of religious practice and meditations.

Nov. 21, Walk 7- Mehrauli village

The oldest inhabited are – Mehrauli is fascination for step-wells, sufi shrines, tombs etc. Heard of the Phoolwalookisair?

Nov. 28, Walk 8 - Sufis in Nizamuddin

Have you ever wondered why Emperor Humayun is buried in Nizamuddin? Here we'll learn about Sufi culture, and visit the shrine of one of the most revered Sufi saints as well as the tombs of poets, emperors and princesses buried in the vicinity.

Dec. 12, Walk 9 – Mutiny on the metro

Here we'll travel by Metro to discover the 1857 Mutiny sites scattered throughout Old Delhi. We'll go back in time to explore this pivotal point of Indian history. We visit hidden memorials, observation towers, mosque etc. all connected with India First War of Independence.

Dec. 19, Walk 10 - River Yamuna

We travel a short way outside Delhi to see the Yamuna in a pristine state (truly!) and fine monuments from the Tughlaq era. Perhaps we'll also visit 'Little Varanasi' and see the ghats!
